THE SIX HOLY HABITS

Just a reminder that Bishop Philip is inviting each one of us to develop and put into practice six holy habits for this time of change and deep personal renewal:

- to keep Sunday special, a family day, by attending Mass;
- to spend 5 minutes a day in prayer using the Scriptures;
- to do penance on Fridays, and to serve the poor and needy;
- every fortnight to make a Holy Half Hour before the Blessed Sacrament;
- to go to Confession once a month; and to join a small group for formation, prayer and fellowship.

A PERSONAL MESSAGE FROM BISHOP PHILIP to the Clergy and Faithful of the Diocese

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

After more than a decade as your Bishop and in common with my predecessor, I am writing to let you know that I will be taking a sabbatical this autumn from 5th September until late November. I will be spending most of the time at the Catholic University of America in Washington, where I will be undertaking theological research, and living at the Dominican House of Studies. Upon return, I will then take my annual spiritual retreat and a few days away.

The sabbatical will give time for prayer, reflection and renewal – key tenets of our collective mission – which, please God, will enable me to fulfil the ministry of Bishop with even greater energy in the years ahead, as I lead our Diocesan journey to become a simpler, humbler and bolder church, in accordance with our ten-year mission plan, *You Will be My Witnesses*.

The Diocese will be ably looked after by our two Vicars General, Canon David Hopgood, Vicar for Clergy, and Fr. James McAuley, Moderator of the Curia, and by our Episcopal Vicars and senior members of our Support and Administration Service. I am grateful to them for making this leave of absence possible. I am grateful too to the Chapter of Canons for their encouragement and support.

I look forward to returning with fresh vigour for the important work ahead of *Bringing People Closer to Jesus Christ through His Church* through the realisation of You Will be My Witnesses. Please pray for me – as I will for you.

The importance of healing in sharing the Good News

So many people today declare that they are not interested in religion, but they are far more open to talking about faith if they can see that it produces tangible results, for example through healing. This was the approach that Jesus frequently took – and it's a mission that He passed on to us, His followers. As Pope Francis said in The Joy of the Gospel: "In virtue of their baptism, all the members of the People of God have become missionary disciples.... Every Christian is challenged, here and now, to be actively engaged in evangelization."

On July 22nd there is an opportunity to participate in a free mini-retreat morning on Zoom that will show us how healing is a powerful element in helping us to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. This meeting is hosted by "ADoRE" one of the longest-running charismatic days of renewal in the country. The session includes Mass, Adoration, Praise and Worship and inspired Teaching on practical ways to evangelise.

Guest speaker is **Marcin Stetner** of the Cor et Lumen Christi Charismatic Community.. Marcin is a gifted preacher and God uses him powerfully in healing. He has led evangelistic events and discipleship conferences for many years and thousands of people, mostly young adults, have given their lives to Jesus, been filled with the Spirit and discipled as a fruit of his ministry in the community.

This is the latest part of ADoRE's Zoom course to inspire Parish Evangelisation: "Proclaim the Good News - we are called to be Missionary Disciples" which is running until November, usually on the fourth Saturday of each month. We hope you can let your parishioners know about this opportunity for spiritual renewal and formation and encourage their participation in the monthly zoom meetings.
