FR JOHN'S ACCOMMODATION REVIEW

Some of you may be aware that the Diocese has not been able to offer me accommodation, or related costs, to support my work within the diocese, and beyond, since September 2022. The Sacred Heart Pastoral Council made a decision to cover my utilities since July 2024, for which I remain very grateful.

Following a meeting of the Diocesan Trustees a few days ago, it was decided that a contribution should now be made to assist my rental expenses, in addition to covering other running costs such as utilities, backdating the same from March 2025. Essentially, this means I will receive £450 per calendar month (50% of the rent), in addition to the usual stipend and utility. This will continue until a further review is conducted during the Autumn of 2025.

I am indebted to the parishioners of Sacred Heart who will be 'footing the bill' for all of this. In addition to supporting me as a person, you are supporting the ministry I offer in the Lord's name in a lot of different places. Simply put, I could not do it without you! Thank you so much for all your support, and apologise for being a bit of drain on the parish finances for the present. I will, of course, keep you updated as to the outcome of the further review towards the end of the year. God bless. Fr John

Sixth Sunday of Easter - 2025 - Hook

Welcome Home. When I was 21, I started my own business. One day after Church over coffee, a parishioner approached me about her favourite chopping board. It had split and needed repair. Having glued it back together, tidied it up, linseed oiled it, I drove round to her lovely house perched on the banks of the River Hamble. At the front door I read 'Welcome' on the doormat. The lady answered the door. "Hello John, please go around to the Tradesman's Entrance and wait there."

My heart was troubled. It still is. How could this be? I believed we were brother and sister under God. We attend Mass together every week, and the mat! Despite it all, I was not welcome in her home. I wonder if God feels a bit like that with you and I sometimes. Do we keep God waiting on the doorstep, like some kind of Tradesman, useful, but not part of the family, not involved in the parts of my life I hold most dear?

Homes come in all shapes and sizes. I was chatting with my legal boss, Kevin Hennessy, the other day. Reminiscing over the past 15 years ago, I described the Law Firm as a family, a kind of second home. I remember my first hearing at Reading Magistrates Court. Kevin was sitting behind me. Having made my representations, a whisper in my ear. "Well, that was a pile of rubbish John!" He didn't really say that. J He just put his hand on my shoulder, which spoke more than words.

Two points. First, we need to be thankful to those who have provided those places we have called home: Where we have learned; where we have grown; where we have been given the chance to make mistakes; to get up and have another go. Second, we need to allow God to put his hand on our shoulder. He's sitting right behind you, always. Why not **Welcome, Him into your home,** that place you hold most dear. Don't keep Him waiting on the doorstep. In your own words, invite Him in, receive His Life, His Grace, and you will **receive Peace like no other**.

John 14:23-29

Jesus replied, "Anyone who loves me will obey my teaching. My Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them. Anyone who does not love me will not obey my teaching. These words you hear are not my own; they belong to the Father who sent me.

"All this I have spoken while still with you. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid. "You heard me say, 'I am going away and I am coming back to you.' If you loved me, you would be glad that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I. I have told you now before it happens, so that when it does happen you will believe.
