

Pentecost – 2025 - Hook

Divine Currency. I like to support small farm shops. Before I went to one recently, I scoured the flat for some bank notes as I knew they would probably prefer cash. On arrival, I selected a couple of bits and went to the till. "Oh, no," she said. "We don't take cash these days. The bank charge us to process cash. Have you got a card?" Can you believe it?

It's a similar situation in the Bank of Heaven. Only one currency accepted. God doesn't accept denominations of self-interest. He doesn't even recognise impressive, disciplined lives, meaning no harm to others. The Divine banking system doesn't accept the currency that is pride, the belief that I don't need saving, or worse, that I can save myself.

No. The Bank of Heaven accepts only one currency, one unit of infinite value that is the currency of love, perfectly imaged in the person of Jesus Christ. The bank notes show the hands and side of the Lord, as using the currency of love will bring sacrifice and pain at times. The Divine currency is driven not by the FTSE or Nasdaq, but the infinite power that is the Holy Spirit constantly pouring from God's heart. The Holy Spirit drives the economy of heaven and has come among us to drive the earthly economy too. We are invited, exhorted, to allow God's Spirit access to our lives, our particular spheres of influence, to guide, challenge and change us, to ignite and energise all we do. Heaven is to begin now.

There is an obstacle in the way. Unforgiveness. Thus, Jesus said,

"Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone's sins, their sins are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven."

Sin matters. The retention of sin leads to death, unless it is confronted and forgiven. Forgiveness is only found in Jesus. We believe in Him, we rely upon Him, we follow Him, all done under the power and influence of the Holy Spirit. Believing in Him will not only releases/absolves, **it empowers us to truly love, to live in the economy of heaven now.**

So, what are we going to do? Carry on as I always have, hoping for the best, relying on myself? Or am I going to really believe God's Word, start afresh, and allow the Holy Spirit in.
