Authority. I was on my way to a visit a client when I saw a number of emergency vehicles up ahead. As I approached, I could see a car in the ditch. Just before I passed the scene a Police Officer beckoned me. He obviously needed some help. I pulled over and got out of the car. He asked me if I knew what the speed limit was for the road. I confirmed it was 50 mph. He then alleged I was travelling in excess of the limit. A bit of me – a big bit – wanted to challenge how he could possibly come to this conclusion without the assistance of any device. I bit my tongue to receive the chastisement. To placate the Officer, I confirmed my regard for road safety regulations and was let go!

Authority is generally derived from influence. Authority, generally, is a good thing because it promotes order out of chaos to protect us from harm. This reflects something of God's influence, the origin of all order. We should respect it, therefore, even if it is difficult to stomach at times.

The Authority of Christ has another dimension.

"Whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven."

When the Authority of Jesus is shared, as it is with the whole Church through Peter's faith today, two options arise. First, I accept the authority of Christ, to be challenged, changed, 'loosed', forgiven, to live free from fear, to love and serve God and neighbour all my days. Or, I reject the Lord's authority, to continue on as I always have, carrying the burden my unforgiveness imposes, to live miserably in fear and darkness.

Churches, Christians, that reveal the Authority of Christ will attract the homeless man, just last evening, who knew someone at Sacred Heart cared. The Authority of Christ will look like our Confirmation group, also last evening, who spent time recognising Jesus present in those who have inspired and influenced their lives to date, Mums, Dads, teachers, friends. The Authority of Christ will look like those pouring their hearts out to God in Confession, acknowledging failure, yet believing their sins will be forgiven, loosed, by the Lord, becoming the most authentic Christians alive. **Accept** HIS Authority today. Be loosed. Be Free.
