The Peace of Christ.

'Peace to this house.' If someone who promotes peace is there, your peace will rest on them; if not, it will return to you.

During the week, I felt compelled to get involved in a 'peace mission'. A Catholic MP hit the BBC news because he had been publicly denounced by his parish priest for allegedly voting for the recently passed Assisted Dying Bill. The priest allegedly used his 'authority' to inform the congregation that said MP is now banned from receiving Holy Communion forthwith.

The theme of authority continues from last week. There is authority, and there is the Authority of Christ. Today we heard how the Lord gave **His** authority to the seventy-two disciples

The Authority of Christ, in the power of the Holy Spirit, brings Peace to God's People. This Peace, if accepted, brings about the environment where vision becomes clear, consciences clarify. Minds infected by fear and vitriol will not see clearly. They will, inevitably, make erroneous decisions, which gives power – oftentimes unwittingly - to the influence of evil. The evil one is only defeated when we understand who our Father is, who we truly are, as His sons and daughters. Do you believe this? Decision time again.

Brothers and Sisters, this is our mission, to convey the truth to each other, to every single person, that we are all no less than God's children. We have been sent out, together, to leave the comfort zones of our homes, friendship groups, material attachments, even churches, to **bring the Peace of Christ to everyone** we come across, priests included! Only then, by His Grace, will right judgement - God's judgement - reign.

Luke 10:1-12; 17-20

After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them two by two ahead of him to every town and place where he was about to go. He told them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field. Go! I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Do not take a purse or bag or sandals; and do not greet anyone on the road.

"When you enter a house, first say, 'Peace to this house.' If someone who promotes peace is there, your peace will rest on them; if not, it will return to you. Stay there, eating and drinking whatever they give you, for the worker deserves his wages. Do not move around from house to house.

"When you enter a town and are welcomed, eat what is offered to you. Heal the sick who are there and tell them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' But when you enter a town and are not welcomed, go into its streets and say, 'Even the dust of your town we wipe from our feet as a warning to you. Yet be sure of this: The kingdom of God has come near.' I tell you, it will be more bearable on that day for Sodom than for that town.

The seventy-two returned with joy and said, "Lord, even the demons submit to us in your name." He replied, "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven. I have given you authority to trample on snakes and scorpions and to overcome all the power of the enemy; nothing will harm you. However, do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven."
