

22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time – 2025 – Hook

'He was being carefully watched.'

I was carefully watching an elderly couple ahead of me, really struggling to push a wheelchair — with him in it - and a large suitcase up the hill towards Brighton Railway Station a few weeks ago. I passed them by. A few moments passed. A voice in my head screamed, "What are you doing, John?" I stopped, turned around and walked back towards the couple. "Can I help?" I enquired, as I reached for the handle on the top of the suitcase. "Are you trying to steal my case?" the lady asked. Not really. J "We're fine," she said, "but thank you anyway." Today, Jesus warns us against the perils of over complicating, life, overthinking, which is the preoccupation of religion. These highly qualified Pharisees, experts in the law, the canon lawyers of the Lord's day, were asked two very simple 'yes/no answer' questions. Number One, is it a good thing to heal someone, if you have power to do so, even if it's on a Sunday? Number Two, if your child, or your ox, gets stuck down a well, also on a Sunday, should you fetch them out?

'They remained silent...they had nothing to say."

Over complication, overthinking, happens when we take our eyes of the Way of Jesus. When I saw that couple, for the first few moments at least, I overcomplicated the situation. How might they react if I offer to help? Might they delay me for my meeting? For those moments, I blocked God's Grace. I failed to take a little time out to literally meet Jesus Christ, present in that man and woman.

Brothers and Sisters, we are being carefully watched. This coming week, carefully watch, carefully notice people, carefully notice needs. Be full of care. Don't allow anything or anyone to stop you assisting someone, when you notice a need. When you notice someone, you notice Jesus Christ, and you will be exalted for it. If you don't notice a need this week you're not looking hard enough!

Luke 14:1-14

One Sabbath, when Jesus went to eat in the house of a prominent Pharisee, he was being carefully watched. There in front of him was a man suffering from abnormal swelling of his body. Jesus asked the Pharisees and experts in the law, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath or not?" But they remained silent. So, taking hold of the man, he healed him and sent him on his way. Then he asked them, "If one of you has a child or an ox that falls into a well on the Sabbath day, will you not immediately pull it out?" And they had nothing to say. When he noticed how the guests picked the places of honour at the table, he told them this parable: "When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take the place of honour, for a person more distinguished than you may have been invited. If so, the host who invited both of you will come and say to you, 'Give this person your seat.' Then, humiliated, you will have to take the least important place. But when you are invited, take the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he will say to you, 'Friend, move up to a better place.' Then you will be honoured in the presence of all the other guests. For all those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted." Then Jesus said to his host, "When you give a luncheon or dinner, do not invite your friends, your brothers or sisters, your relatives, or your rich neighbours; if you do, they may invite you back and so you will be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed. Although they cannot repay you, you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."
