All Saints - 2025 - Hook

Saints and Sinners. I grew up with Matt and his family in the 70's. We went to the same school. Co-incidentally, his parents later moved to Christchurch, where I used to serve. Matt died aged just 54 and was buried last Thursday. The Priory was absolutely packed. Much about his life came to light after his death.

Matt rarely went to church, but he believed that every single person was his brother or sister. If he perceived a need in someone, he personally accepted the invitation to help. Matt paid someone's deposit for a house simply to get them on the property ladder. To another, hitherto unknown, he gave a bed for the night.

To another homeless person he gave his time, every day, as "this might be the only connection he had with another human being that day."

Brothers and Sisters, the way Matt chose to live was not about being 'nice'. Most of us practice that, especially when we are to benefit in some way. We 'pay back' a good turn. Matt 'paid forward', a phrase his wife Gilly taught me, giving without any hope of return. People do this when they are connected to God, when they allow God's Spirit to drive their spirit. Such people recognise every person as a neighbour.

Matt was so instinctively generous, he didn't even know he was doing it, which conforms exactly to the Way of Jesus.

'...when you give to the poor and do acts of kindness, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing.'

Single handedness is a sure sign that someone lives in the groove of Grace, they are repenting and are repentant; that they are living the life of a saint. They will value God and neighbour more than money. They will be instinctively generous, compassionate whenever they get the chance. They will be gently strong seeking justice for all, slow to judge, rich in mercy, which is the life of Blessedness.

If you are a sinner, you can become a saint. Recognise your sin, accept forgiveness, repent, keep repenting - having a change of heart. Live in the groove of Grace. Today's feast is a deep-down reminder to become better people.
