I come from Dublin, Ireland, and have had the privilege of ministering in Africa, Spain, the Americas, and within parish communities in the Southwark and Westminster dioceses. I have also served as chaplain at the Heathrow Detention Centre and currently have the blessing of serving as chaplain to the traveling communities for the Diocese of Westminster.

I am delighted to be invited to Sacred Heart Parish to lead your Advent Day of Reflection. I understand that the runup to Christmas can be a busy time for us all, but I hope you will be able to join us for this special day. During the day, we will focus on themes such as "Finding Stillness in a Busy World," "Meeting God in Solitude and Silence," with talks titled "You Can't Hurry Love." And "The Naked Prophet". #### Dedication of the Lateran Basilica – 2025 – Hook

**Fit for Purpose.** During the past week I was visiting Essex. I booked into a rather nice hotel called Orsett Hall. Beautiful oak doors, all mod cons, with a bathroom that gleamed at you when you opened the door! In the morning, I went to have a shower. As I approached the shower door, I noticed it was a little loose. I went to move it and the whole thing came away in my hand. I was a tad livid. Looked good but not fit for purpose.

Jesus was a tad livid in the Gospel today. The mission and purpose of the Temple was to reveal God to the world. The 'Court of the Gentiles', approximately half of the entire Temple complex, was designated for non-Jews to offer their own prayer to God. Yet this sacred space had been entirely hijacked by the traders. The Temple looked good – at least it did prior to AD73 - but it had forgotten its purpose, to reveal God to the world.

So, Jesus came to replace the unfit Temple with Himself, the Body of Christ, which is the Church. The risen Lord Jesus continues to reveal God's presence to and through us by Grace in countless ways. Our purpose, the purpose of the Church, is to reveal God most vividly in the world in which we live. Thus we – the Church, our parish, our families, as individuals too, continue to measure our life against the benchmark of Blessedness, the Beatitudes of last week. But do we?

We profess to be people who value God more than money preferring instead to invest in people. But do we? Blessed are we, the Church, when we invest in those who are suffering by our understanding, kindness and compassion. But do we? Blessed are you, Blessed is the Church, when gentleness speaks to power in hungering and thirsting after what is right. But are we?

Blessed are the humble. 'True humility is not thinking less of yourself; it is thinking of yourself less," - CS Lewis. When we do this, we reveal God, which is the benchmark of Love that makes us fit for heaven.

#### John 2:13-22

When it was almost time for the Jewish Passover, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. In the temple courts he found people selling cattle, sheep and doves, and others sitting at tables exchanging money. So, he made a whip out of cords, and drove all from the temple courts, both sheep and cattle; he scattered the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. To those who sold doves he said, "Get these out of here! Stop turning my Father's house into a market!" His disciples remembered that it is written: "Zeal for your house will consume me." The Jews then responded to him, "What sign can you show us to prove your authority to do all this?" Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days."

They replied, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and you are going to raise it in three days?" But the temple he had spoken of was his body. After he was raised from the dead, his disciples recalled what he had said. Then they believed the scripture and the words that Jesus had spoken.
