Fifth Sunday in Lent – 2026

Living Life. One of the hardest parts of supporting trainees is correction. I always feel a total hypocrite. I have permission to share this with you. A seminarian was scheduled to look after a cremation recently, under my guidance. He failed to attend the funeral. He assumed it was taking place at church. It's a mistake you make only once as a priest. I did exactly the same years ago. The hurt caused through a moment of carelessness like this can be as devastating as intentional, deliberate harm.

In response to my correction, he said "It's obvious... **It is my fault...I accept full responsibility.** Thanks for calling it out...**I'll take steps...**" I rejoiced in his reply as there were no excuses, no defences. God honours his honest humility. Felix exemplifies what it is to be a Christian. To accept my fault, to take full responsibility, to thank God for pointing me back to the Way. Brothers and Sisters, this is **how to live LIFE.**

Today, the Lord reminds us that there are NOT two lives to be lived: This life, and the one yet to come. No. Jesus says there is one life to be lived.

"I am the resurrection and the life."

Jesus is The Key to everything that matters in this world as well as the next. Life can only be humanly lived in relationship, in relationship to the person that is our Lord Jesus Christ, the Revelation of God's love. Now, this minute, we learn to love, we learn to live in heaven.

Truly loving anyone involves hard work, perseverance, a willingness to overcome and overlook failures, to reconcile, to get up again, and again, to keep reaching out, to keep on keeping on. Our relationship with God is alarmingly similar. We mess up. We pretend that we don't mess up. We do our own thing. Then we feel that nudge, to stop, to look at life differently.

"I am the resurrection and the life."

Do you believe this Brothers and Sisters? **Do you want to believe this?** If you do, walk the Way of Jesus, the Way of Repentance. Keep reaching out, keep asking for His Grace, keep receiving His forgiveness, healing and guidance. As Jerry said to me earlier this week after I had anointed him, "See you in heaven, Father John." **We are preparing for heaven.**

The Veiling of Statues - during Passiontide (the final two weeks of Lent) is an ancient Catholic tradition where sacred images are covered in purple cloth to focus the congregation's attention on the impending Passion and Death of Jesus Christ. The veils represent how Christ's glory was hidden as He entered His suffering and death. It reflects the Gospel of John (8:59), where Jesus "hid himself" to escape being stoned.

By removing beautiful art from view, the Church invites a "fast of the eyes," stripping away distractions to focus purely on the liturgy and the words of the Passion narrative. The purple cloth is a sign of penitence and grief. The absence of familiar images creates a sense of longing for the joy of Easter. Images are usually veiled before the First Vespers (Evening Prayer) of the **Fifth Sunday of Lent** (the Saturday evening before). **Crucifixes** are unveiled on **Good Friday** at the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion to emphasize the Sacrifice on the Cross. Statues and icons are unveiled during the **Easter Vigil** on Holy Saturday, signalling the Resurrection and the restoration of joy.

NEW PARISH DATABASE SYSTEM - CHURCHSUITE

The Parish is now using a new system called CHURCHSUITE. This is a modern parish database management system that allows Parishes to more effectively store parishioner information, communicate with parishioners e.g. Newsletterdistribution, organise church rotas, manage Gift Aid, etc. It enables all parishioner information & data privacy consents to be safely secured in one place & provides full compliance with GDPR Privacy Law. It has been sourced & provided by the Diocese & is currently being adopted across all Parishes in our Pastoral Area.

As a result. we therefore need to renew all the information we hold about parishioners. Therefore, to ensure you remain registered as a parishioner and to continue to receive communications from the Parish, including the Newsletter, please do kindly fill out a new Registration Form at the earliest possible opportunity.

There will eventually be a cut-off date when Newsletters will only be sent via CHURCHSUITE & this will be announced in advance. Please note the following:
